The substances listed below may ONLY be initiated by a Nurse, Midwife or Aboriginal & Torres Strait Islander Health Practitioner, without the direction of a medical practitioner, when in conjunction with the following Scheduled Substance Treatment Protocols as listed in Part B of the [Gazette Notice](#).
